3. TRAVEL AND TOURIST INFORMATION

3.1. Transport from airport to Event Centre

Event Centre is readily accessible by major roads and public transport.

3.2. Directions for obtaining entry permits (visas)

Passports and maybe a visa are needed to enter Poland for some countries. Poland is a full Schengen member state. Application for the visa should be submitted at the nearest Polish Embassy. If you need visa help or special documentation, such as an "Invitation Letter", please send an email to: office@wmtboc2025.pl no later than 1st May 2025.

Please make sure that you allow for sufficient time (at least 3 months) for invitation letters and visa processing. Also note that visa regulations are subject to change. Please double-check your specific visa requirements.

4. TRANSPORT


All the competitions are within 10 km from the Event Centre and can be reached by bike (except for the sprint, which is about 30-40 km by car from the EC). The organisers do not offer any transport from the EC to the competitions.







5. EMBARGOED AREAS



The areas marked in red on the map are fully embargoed, which means that these areas may not be entered at all (unless specifically permitted by the organisers). The embargoed areas are out of bounds for all potential participants and team members, including competitors, team leaders, coaches, doctors, escorts, and any other person who through their knowledge of the terrain may influence the result of the competitions.

So, no participants and no one with a potential connection to a team (athletes or others) may visit the embargoed areas, not even without a map.

The area marked in yellow is open for everyday use (e.g. living, school, etc.) - but the use of orienteering maps there is prohibited.

Roads marked in green passing through the embargoed area are open for everyday travel (commuting).

7. MAPS AND TERRAINS

All maps will be made according to the International Specification for MTB Orienteering Maps ISMTBOM 2022 valid at the time of the event (see https://orienteering.sport/iof/mapping).

Competition Scale / vertical contour intervals	Description of terrain	Recent map sample showing type of terrain
Sprint 1:5 000 / 2,5 m	Forest terrain. Partly flat, partly moderate hills and dunes.	
Middle 1:10 000 / 2,5 m	Very high density of tracks and paths.	
Mass start 1:10 000 / 2,5 m	Ground is soft and sandy. Different kind of vegetation; mostly pine and beech wood.	
Long 1:15 000 / 2,5 m	Mostly very good visibility.	
Relay 1:10 000 / 2,5 m	Terrain is fast, but very dense network of tracks requires careful navigation.

8. CLASSES AND PARTICIPATION

WMTBOC

- There is one class for women (called Women) and one for men (called Men). There are no age restrictions.
- All competitors must be citizens of the country of the federation they are representing.
- Competitors participate at their own risk. Third party insurance and personal injury insurance is compulsory and is the responsibility of the competitors' federation or themselves.
- All competitors represent a federation. Each federation may enter a team of an unlimited number of competitors and team officials.
- In each individual competition, every federation may enter up to 6 women and 6 men plus
 the current World Champions for the distance. Additionally, each federation may enter up
 to a further 2 women and 2 men, who qualify for the Women U23 and Men U23 classes
 respectively, in the Sprint, the Middle distance and the Mass start. No U23 classes are offered
 in the Long distance.
- In the Relay, each federation may enter up to 2 women's teams and 2 men's teams, each consisting of 3 team members.
- Each competitor must have a valid IOF Athlete Licence.

JWMTBOC

- There is one class for women (W20) and one for men (M20). Only competitors who are entitled to compete in these classes may participate.
- All competitors must be citizens of the country of the federation they are representing.
- Competitors participate at their own risk. Third party insurance and personal injury insurance is compulsory and is the responsibility of the competitors' federation or themselves.
- All competitors represent a federation. Each federation may enter a team of an unlimited number of competitors and a number of team officials.
- For all individual competitions, each federation may enter up to 6 women and 6 men.
- In the Relay, each federation may enter up to 2 women's teams and 2 men's teams, each consisting of 3 team members.





9. ENTRY

9.1. Entry procedure Entries are made in IOF Eventor.

9.2. Entry deadlines

Team size deadline 10th June 2025

Entries must be submitted no later than 10th June 2025 and with the following information:

- total number of competitors of each gender
- number of competitors in each individual competition
- number of relay teams
- number of team officials
- team manager's name, email address and phone number

Team names deadline 1st August 2025

No later than 1st August 2025 the following information must be submitted:

- each competitor's name, year of birth, gender resp. class, and the competition/s in which he/she will compete
- each competitor's number of the electronic punching card (if competitors want to use their own card)
- names of all team officials

Late entries and name changes

Late entries and changes will be accepted but an additional fee will be charged \rightarrow 10.2.

After 8th August 2025, no entries will be accepted.







10. FEES AND PAYMENT

10.1. Participation fees

All fees are in Euros and – except for the Relay – per person.

10.2. Late entries and changes

Entries after the deadlines (but no later than 8th August 2025) and name changes will be accepted. For late entries and changes an additional fee will be charged:

- surcharge of 20% for entries after the team size deadline 10th June 2025
- surcharge of 50% for entries after the team names deadline 1st August 2025
- fee of 10€ for name changes after 1st August 2025

10.3. Payment

Deadline for payment

- Full payment of all entry and accreditation fees must be made no later than 30th June 2025.
- Late payments will be subject to an additional fee of 10% of the total amount
- Additional payments (possible other fees, e.g. rental fee for punching card etc.) are preferred together with the entry fee. However, payment on site will be possible as well.

10.4. Cancellation of the event

If the event has to be cancelled after 1st July 2025, the organisers will retain 15€ per participant (competitor or team official) in order to cover committed costs.

10.5. Withdrawals and refunds

- Refund of 80 % for withdrawals after the team size deadline of 10th June 2025
- Refund of 50 % for withdrawals after the team names deadline of 1st August 2025.

11. ACCOMMODATION AND FOOD

Participants are free to choose their accommodation and meals options. However, it is recommended that athletes and team officials stay at the official accommodation at the Event Centre: Mercure Hotel Wiązowna Brant, located in Majdan https://www.branthotel.pl.

The Mercure Hotel Wiazowna Brant offers:

- Single room without breakfast 330 PLN (about 77 EUR)
- Single room with breakfast 370 PLN (about 86 EUR)
- Double room without breakfast 350 PLN (about 81 EUR) per room
- Double room with breakfast 410 PLN (about 95 EUR) per room
- Additional person in the room:
- without extra breakfast to a double room for a third person 100 PLN (about 23 EUR)
- with extra breakfast for a double room for a third person 140 PLN (about 33 EUR) Meals are also available at the hotel.

12. COMPETITION RULES

12.1. Information about rules

All competitions will be organised in accordance with the following rules valid at the time of the event:

- IOF MTBO Competition Rules
- Special Rules MTBO World Cup

All the rules can be found at https://orienteering.sport/mtbo/competition-rules

Further general MTBO rules:

- Competitors must get to all control points with their bikes.
- The bicycle must be with the competitor at all times.
- Wearing a rigid safety helmet is compulsory during competitions and training sessions.
- It is forbidden to use roads or tracks marked with purple crosses or a purple zigzag line on the map.
- Riding outside the mapped area during the competition is not allowed.
- · National traffic rules must be followed.

Non-compliant competitors or competitors who break any rule may be disqualified.





12. COMPETITION RULES

12.2. Info about off-track riding

Riding off the track, trail or path is generally allowed, but it is forbidden in cultivated land such as farmlands, forestry cultivation and similar. Off-track riding speed may vary a lot.

12.3. Controls not situated on paths

Control points may be off-track, in rideable open areas. They will be set so as not to require control descriptions.

12.4. Anti-doping

Doping is strictly forbidden and the organisers of WMTBOC/World Cup and JWMTBOC are dedicated to supporting the anti-doping authorities in their work. Doping tests are always carried out in accordance with the procedures described in the WADA International Standard for Testing. The IOF Anti-Doping Rules and the World Anti-Doping Code apply. Athletes who are selected for doping tests must bring an official identification (with photo) to the doping test area. The athlete should also bring along their therapeutic use exemption (TUE) if applicable. In general, it is advisable that the athletes bring along their ID to all the competitions and events.

13. COMPETITION INFORMATION

13.1. Punching system

SPORTident Air+ (system for contactless punching with SI Active Cards SIAC) with a working range of 150 – 180 cm will be used.

It is recommended that competitors use a backup SIAC/a second SIAC. The data recorded in the backup SIAC will only be used when the main SIAC did not work properly, i.e. in the case of failure of the main SIAC during the race. The backup SIAC cannot be used to rank a competitor if they lost their main card.

Competitors may use their own SIAC, but organisers will provide SIACs for rent.

Rental SIACs will be available at € 20 for the whole event – deposit € 80.

14. OPPORTUNITIES FOR TRAINING

From June 19-22, a training camp combined with competitions (WRE) is organised in Warsaw (an area that is adjacent to the WMTBOC maps). The camp will include WRE (long, middle, sprint, mass start) competitions, as well as relays (Polish Championships).

15. MISCELLANEOUS

15.1. Parallel events

Open competitions for those who are not participants of WMTBOC/ World Cup and JWMTBOC will be offered. These public races be held after middle distance competition, mass start and long distance competition respectively. Three different courses (long, middle and short) will be offered.

15.2. Climate and hazards

Climate

Mazovia experiences quite moderate climate. July and August are the warmest months in Warsaw and surrounding places, but the average temperature is about to 23 ° C. Possible rain – but most of the time at least the first half of the day is sunny.

Description of any hazards

- Wild animals like deer, wild boars, moose etc. might be present in the forests of competition areas.
- Wild bees can possibly be encountered in the competition areas.
- Ticks are not that commonly found in the pine forests, which are prevailing around Warsaw, but there are places where they can be encountered. They can spread Lyme disease or borreliosis, and tick-borne encephalitis (TBE). Competitors are asked to protect themselves and to check for ticks after every ride in the forest.

15.3. Media

We welcome all media representatives to cover the competitions of WMTBOC & JWMTBOC and World Cup in Warsaw/ Poland. For media accreditation and related requests, please send an email to: media@wmtboc2025.pl Accreditation should be made by 20th July 2025.

- The media service includes a working area at the Event Centre and the arenas with free Wi-Fi and complimentary coffee or tea, parking close to the arena, and access to some controls in the competition areas.
- Media representatives and team officials are encouraged to bring their own Internet-enabled devices, as neither computers nor Wi-Fi services can be offered by the organisers.
- Weather-protected, quiet working space for media representatives will be provided in all finish arenas.
- Accredited media representatives are given the opportunity to take part in the Model Event.
- If desired, the organisers will assist media representatives with hotel accommodation booking.





15. MISCELLANEOUS

15.4. Competition clothing

Competitors must wear the team clothing of their federation during all official events.

15.5. Insurance and liability

Everybody participates in competitions and other activities associated with the WMTBOC &JWMTBOC at their own risk, and each person is responsible for their own insurance coverage (illness/accident and third party insurance).

The organisers decline any liability; they are not responsible for theft or similar incidents either. Participant are encouraged to take necessary precautions.
