MAPS, TERRAINS:

- Koneser Square scale 1:4000, e-2,5 m, author Aleksander Obernikhin, new map (photos of the area, photos)

 Dense building blocks from 80s & Koneser Square former manufacturing fabric, modernised into entertainment area with offices, cafes, museums. Several narrow but active streets to cross. Several multilevel structures. Totally flat terrain.
- Old Town scale 1:4000, e-2,5 m, authors Jacek Morawski, Maciej Gędziorowski, (photos of the area)

 Typical European Old Town with no cars, 30m hill and many tourists passing by. Narrow streets. Link to the map.
- Warsaw University of Technology (Chemistry + Transport faculties) scale 1:200, author Aleksander Obernikhin 2 simple, yet not fully symmetrical 5 floor buildings with total of 18 staircases. Course starts by one of the buildings, continuing outside and entering the other building (several times). 2025 IOF indoor symbols to be used link.
- Szmulowizna scale 1:5000, e-2,5 m, author Aleksander Obernikhin, new map (photos of the area)

 Dense building blocks from 60s-70s, with over 100 canopies (passages through the building), some of which are gate-closed (shown on the map). Many narrow streets to cross. Several multilevel structures. Totally flat terrain.

WEATHER:

March in Poland can be very unpredictable. Be prepared for changing conditions, with temperatures ranging from 0°C to 20°C and weather varying from warm and sunny to cold and snowy. Please remember to bring a **headlamp** for the first and third stages (indoor race includes 2 buildings,

lamp required for running between them).

Results and awards will be based on the total time from all 4 stages. Saturday's Long City Race will also be awarded in accordance with CityRace EuroTour rules. Awards will be presented after the final stage.

Rules of Polish federation for 2026 are applied.

ABOUT WARSAW:

The city is located in the middle of Poland. Easily accessed by trains; there is an airport inside the city («Chopin») and two which are 1h by train away from Warsaw («Modlin» and «Radom»). The city is large, with heavy traffic, but also many green areas. Please note that big grocery stores are closed on Sundays.



ACCOMODATION

Hotels in Warsaw are relatively affordable compared to Western Europe. Many of them are located close to the city center, thus easily communicated with all competition stages. For budget hotels you can expect prices range from approximately €30 to €50 per night for a double room. Mid-range hotels prices vary between €50 and €90. Luxury hotels would cost from €90 up to €160 per night.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT IN WARSAW

At every underground/train station you will find ticket machines, where 20min (one mean of transport) or 75 and 90min tickets a re available (Transport Zone 1 includes the whole city - but make sure to not buy 50% discount ticket). Seniors 70+ can take public transport for free in Warsaw with an ID.

SPORTIDENT:

SportIdent and SportIdent Air+ systems will be used. SportIdent can be rented at the competition center.
